Our goal is to expand the student board member position to every locality across the United States, creating a robust, democratic framework that represents and supports the students of today and tomorrow. In fostering skilled, knowledgeable and empowered student board members, we are not just supporting individual student leaders; we are **uplifting entire student communities to mobilize change** and work alongside educational leaders to **strengthen schools, improve student outcomes, and promote a culture of student-driven governance**.

Democratic Process.

The voices and perspectives of students and young people are essential to effective governance and the vitality of democracy. Youth contribute to democratic society and must therefore be a part of democratic structures and processes, intentionally and by design, through meaningful participation whereby they have the power to shape the laws, policies and decisions that impact them. Furthermore, we advocate for student board members to be chosen democratically as true representatives of their peers, thereby promoting youth civic engagement.

Nonpartisan Youth Civic Engagement.

We are firmly committed to advancing student representation in educational governance and we maintain a non-partisan approach throughout our work, embracing diversity of perspectives and constructive debate as a way of improving decision-making. Elected student board member positions foster a broader culture of civic responsibility among students by providing first-hand experience in voting, receiving representation, policymaking, and accountability. Student board members provide a direct link between school boards and the student body, fostering youth civic engagement in practice.

Student Agency, Voice & Power.

Meaningful youth participation is essential to ensure the education system prepares all students to thrive. Students are uniquely positioned to understand today's education system and to contribute meaningfully to its improvement through their diverse, lived experiences. We believe students are entitled to the right of representation and should be able to influence the systems they are a part of to the same extent as adults. To this end, we believe that student board members should serve on all school boards and state boards of education across the United States, and we believe in expanding the rights of student board members to democratize education and improve student outcomes.

Intergenerational Collaboration & Co-creation.

Our greatest successes come from young people and adults working together to improve education systems. By providing space for both students and adults to share their unique experiences, perspectives, and expertise, we can develop a better understanding of the challenges we face and work together to co-create solutions that are more innovative, inclusive and effective, leading to better outcomes for all.

Fairness in Education & Representation.

All students have the right to a high-quality education, regardless of their background or circumstances. Fairness is a cornerstone of meaningful student representation and vice-versa, as meaningful representation helps all students to thrive. The student board member position should be open and accessible to all students who are interested in the role, without barriers or prerequisites.

Education & Community Building.

To make the most of their role and represent the interests of all students, student board members must understand what school boards are and how they operate. We equip student board members with the knowledge, skills and expertise to effectively navigate their school board, echoing the work of adult-led school board organizations while emphasizing student leadership. Peer-to-peer and near-peer learning and exchange are essential to building a nationwide movement of engaged, empowered and representative student board members that lead positive change for millions of students.

We estimate that as of the 2024-25 school year, there are at least 1,000 student board members serving across 18 states nationwide. As the first and only national network built by, with, and for student board members, NSBMA aims to reach as many student board members as possible.

NSBMA will grow and solidify its membership network. By 2027, at least 100 members will participate in our programming annually from at least six states. Additionally, we will establish robust systems and structures to support and scale up the membership framework.

Student board members usually receive little if any training that is tailored to their specific needs and situation, and often work in isolation, lacking a wider support network. Where training is provided, it is almost always adult-led rather than peer-led. Additionally, school staff and administrators who support student board members lack dedicated spaces to meet and learn from one another.

NSBMA will build high-quality online and offline programming to support and engage with student board members throughout their term and to foster mutual learning and exchange among student board member advisors, hosting at least three regional, in-person conferences with a minimum of 40 participants each by 2027.

A majority of school districts in the United States do not have a student board member, and where the position does exist, the vast majority of student board members do not have voting rights. Additionally, detailed evidence on student board members and their impact is currently lacking. Research can bolster efforts to demonstrate the potential of student voice, including on educational outcomes, and support the expansion of student board member positions and voting rights.

NSBMA will establish itself as a leader and pivotal advocate for expanding the rights and positions of student board members at the local, district and state level, fostering an educational governance landscape in which student voice is indispensable. Our policy and advocacy will be underpinned by research that demonstrates the state and impact of student board members nationwide, with a view to supporting the publication of a comprehensive research report by 2027.
